We asked our members who attended the School Nutrition Association Annual National Conference this year for feedback, here's what they said!

The 2025 School Nutrition Association Annual National Conference (ANC), held July 13–15 in San Antonio, gathered more than 6,000 school nutrition professionals under the theme “It’s Your Moment.” The event celebrated growth, innovation, and connection, with attendees highlighting the joy of networking, learning, and professional recognition. “Meeting new people, old friends, and since this was my first time attending ANC, just the size of it, the classes, the industry show. So much to do,” shared Margery Erckert. Others echoed the same sentiment—catching up with friends, making new connections, and taking in the excitement of the sessions and industry show.

Conference education focused on innovation, equity, and leadership, from creative menu design and student engagement to new technologies and inclusive meal programs. 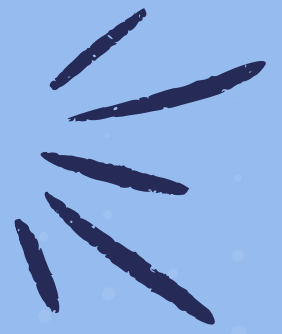


Check out what our attendees thought of the conference:

The 2025 SNA-KS Annual Conference, held October 3–5 in Wichita, brought together school nutrition professionals from across the state for three inspiring days of learning, networking, and collaboration. First-time attendee and new SNA-KS member Brandi Camden shared that the information presented was “amazing, helpful, and insightful.” She noted that learning about the back side of ordering and paperwork was “jaw-dropping,” especially realizing how something as simple as the unavailability of foil lids from overseas can prevent certain products from being ordered. Brandi also praised the food show, calling it “amazing” and appreciating the chance to sample new products, meet vendors, and gather information to bring back to her district.

A highlight of the event was the Silent Auction, which raised funds to support future professional development and scholarship initiatives. Items available for bidding included a collection of school nutrition books gathered over the years by longtime SNA member Barb Depew, signed sports memorabilia, and numerous self-care gift baskets—each contributing to a lively, community-spirited auction. Brandi shared that meeting new people and realizing there’s a network to “bounce info and questions off of” made the experience even more rewarding.
